About Mutete



MUTETE HIV/AIDS FOUNDATION

Mutete HIV/Aids Foundation began its operation in 2012 with a humble beginning. The inspiration for setting up the Mutete HIV/Aids Foundation came from a life experience of Bosco Muyango and James Muyango the founders of Mutete HIV/Aids Foundation who lost their beloved parents to Aids. In the early 1990s, the HIV/AIDS epidemic was still a mystery to much of African society. There was a widespread lack of public knowledge about the epidemic's causes which yielded high levels of discrimination and stigma towards those who were affected by the disease. It was in this time that Mutete founders, Bosco Muyango and James Muyango, then young boys living in Uganda, lost their beloved parents to the disease. Their firsthand experiences of the pain and hardship they faced following the loss of their parents instilled in them a desire to help those who suffered similar hardships. In honor of their late mother, Muteteri, they founded this organization in an effort to encourage and aid those affected and impacted by HIV/AIDS. The named founders chose to begin humbly within their means. They have already begun distributing some food supplies and subsistence support to the families affected with HIV/Aids and orphans in Kampala Mulago area.

The non-profit is based in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and it operates in Uganda and Rwanda.

Statistics in Uganda & Rwanda

HIV/AIDS is widespread in the general population in Uganda and Rwanda. Women, in particular, have high vulnerability to HIV infections due to cultural practices, economic deprivation, low negotiation power, biological and epidemiological factors.

HIV/AIDS STATISTICS IN UGANDA

- ▶ Uganda's average population is 24.442,100
- ▶ 6.5% of Uganda's population is infected with HIV (1,200.000)
- ▶ Almost 90% of the 16.6 million children orphaned by AIDS live in sub-Saharan Africa



HIV/AIDS STATISTICS IN RWANDA

- ▶ Rwanda's average population is 11,370,425
- ▶ In Rwanda, the prevalence amongst women between 20 and 24 years of age is 13.9 percent, whereas prevalence amongst males stands at 8.6 percent. Amongst the 25 to 29 years age group, it stands at 21.5 percent for females and 13.9 percent for men in Rwanda.

Our Mission

THE MISSION OF MUTETE

The mission of Mutete HIV/AIDS Foundation is to promote HIV/AIDS awareness, provide compassionate services through delivering nutritional support to people that are affected by HIV/AIDS and do not have access to good food. Additionally, the foundation will work to educate those infected with HIV in order to help restore their dignity, break the cycle of dependence, create economic independence, and end the stigma among those living with HIV/AIDS, particularly women in Kampala, Uganda and Kigali, Rwanda. In addition, the Mutete HIV/AIDS Foundation will provide HIV/AIDS awareness to the Allegheny County community in Pennsylvania.

WHAT MUTETE HIV/AIDS FOUNDATION OFFERS

Mutete seeks to mitigate the socio-economic impact of HIV/AIDS in selected provinces and communities for people infected or affected by HIV/AIDS.

We will do this through:

- 1 Capacity building to support decentralization of the national response to HIV/AIDS at provincial and community levels
- 2 Education and health support for children from poor families and children affected by HIV/AIDS through partnership with nursery and primary schools. Partnership with local training centers to provide education forums.
- 3 Providing foster families with financial support to ensure that foster children are adequately cared for.
- 4 Agricultural farming to support HIV/AIDS impacted families. Mutete HIV/AIDS foundation will establish a community garden to support its food bank.
